

OF NOTE

Not everyone needs a medical check-up after traveling.

Seek medical care after travelling if you have:

- fever $>37.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ after returning from a malaria endemic area (even months after returning!; main concern: malaria)
- sustained a bite or scratch wound by a mammal (main concern: rabies! **Seek medical advice immediately**)
- severe diarrhea or prolonged / chronic gastrointestinal complaints
- chronic non-healing skin ulcer(s) / insect bite wound(s)
- had unprotected sexual intercourse
- any worrying / unusual symptom appearing during travel or shortly after returning
- taken self-emergency treatment (SBET) against malaria or if you have been treated for malaria during travel (if no symptoms, check-up is only needed within 7 days following treatment).
